Full Day Camp (Entering Grades 3-8)

[Course Code: FD]

Students benefit by participating in three 2-hour IMACS summer academic programs each day: Logic Puzzles, Computer Programming & Virtual Robotics, and Electronics. See the next page for course descriptions.

Time: 9:15am - 4:15pm. Free early drop-off from 8:30am to 9:15am. See after-care info on the next page.

Cost: \$475.

Half Day Camp (Entering Grades 3-8)

[Course Code: HD]

Students benefit by participating in two 90 minute IMACS summer academic programs each day: Logic Puzzles and Computer Programming & Virtual Robotics. See the next page for course descriptions.

Time: 9:00am - 12:00pm. Free early drop-off from 8:30am to 9:00am. Lunch-care is available from 12:00pm to 1:00pm for \$8 per day.

Cost: \$250.

Individual Classes (Entering Grades 1-12)

On "F" weeks (see below), students may enroll in individual classes. Each class meets Monday through Friday for two hours each day (except for campers entering grades 1 or 2). See the next page for more details.

Discounts, Etc.

- ✓ You choose the weeks you want. They do not need to be consecutive. New students are welcome each week.
- ✓ No registration fee. No supply fee.
- ✓ A Full Day student (or Half Day student in Lunch-care) should bring lunch in a cold pack. Snacks and drinks are available for \$0.75 each.
- ✓ A Multiple Class Discount (10% off the lower price) is available for a camper enrolled in only two classes in the same "F" week.

2018 Summer Camp: Individual Classes

Logic Puzzles (Entering Grades 1-8)

[Course Code: LP]

Entering Grades 1-2:

Games! Puzzles! Fun! (But don't tell your kids that they are learning how to reason and are developing a love of mathematical thinking.)

Time: 2:30pm - 4:00pm on "F" weeks. 9:15am - 10:45am on "H" weeks. (Students entering grades 1-2 are not eligible for Full Day or Half Day camps. For 9:15am class, early drop-off is only available with sibling enrolled in Half Day camp. No other after-care, lunch-care, or early drop-off is available for this class.)

Cost: \$150.

Entering Grades 3-8:

Mysteries of pure logic are presented in fun, compelling stories. Painstakingly designed, this class leads students from elementary deductive reasoning to skills that exceed those of most college graduates! Team logic games, exciting tournaments, and, as in every IMACS class, new challenges each week!

Automatically part of Full Day and Half Day enrollments. Times for individual enrollment on "F" weeks:

Grades 3-4: 9:15am - 11:15am; Grades 5-6: 2:15pm - 4:15pm; Grades 7-8: 12:00pm - 2:00pm

Cost: \$190.

Computer Programming & Virtual Robotics (Entering Grades 3-9)

[Course Code: CPVR]

Students don't merely use the computer in this course. They write computer programs! Using the programming language LOGO, developed at MIT, students are challenged by projects designed by the IMACS Curriculum Development Group. With individualized guidance, students develop basic programming and problem-solving skills. Students can also apply these skills in the IMACS Virtual Robotics Lab, where programmable, configurable robots exist in a virtual world that contains the physical realities of friction, acceleration, and conservation of momentum.

Automatically part of Full Day and Half Day enrollments. Three time slots are available for individual enrollment on "F" weeks: 9:15am - 11:15am; 12:00pm - 2:00pm; 2:15pm - 4:15pm.

Cost: \$210.

Electronics (Entering Grades 3-10)

[Course Code: EE]

These classes introduce students to the fascinating world of electronics. Students learn about electrical components such as resistors, diodes, LEDs, capacitors, transistors, and integrated circuits, and use them to design and construct fun projects. Courses are tailored according to age and ability so that each student is able to advance as far as his or her interests and abilities allow. Students may keep the electronic devices that they build.

Automatically part of Full Day enrollments. (Not available on "H" weeks.) Three time slots are available for individual enrollment on "F" weeks: 9:15am - 11:15am; 12:00pm - 2:00pm; 2:15pm - 4:15pm.

Cost: \$230.

University Computer Science (Entering Grades 7-12; Aptitude Test Required)

[Course Code: UCS]

Students pursue an academic, university-level, computer science course. The IMACS curriculum has been used in prestigious programs such as Duke University's Talent Identification Program and Johns Hopkins University's Center for Talented Youth. Students work with interactive tools available only at IMACS and are taught by highly qualified and trained professionals. This class goes well beyond a traditional introductory course, introducing advanced concepts such as recursion, functional programming, object-oriented programming, and artificial intelligence. Contact IMACS to find out if this class is appropriate for your child.

For eligible students, this class replaces Computer Programming & Virtual Robotics in Full Day and Half Day enrollments. Three time slots are available for individual enrollment on "F" weeks: 9:15am - 11:15am; 12:00pm - 2:00pm; 2:15pm - 4:15pm.

Cost: \$230.

After-care

Full Day students should be picked up at 4:15pm (or 5:30pm, if he or she is enrolled in After-care for \$10 per day). Full Day students not picked up by 4:30pm are automatically enrolled in after-care for the day (with payment due when the parents arrive). Half Day students should be picked up at 12:00pm (or 1:00pm, if he or she is enrolled in Lunch-care for \$8 per day). Individual Class students should be picked up at the end of class. After 10 minutes beyond the scheduled pick-up time, parents will be charged a late fee of \$1.00 per minute. Please see back page (Policies and Procedures) for additional information.

Summer Camp Policies & Procedures

Admissions IMACS accepts campers based on their talents and abilities and does not discriminate on the basis of sex, race, nationality, ethnic origin, or other irrelevant criteria.

Media Release IMACS may take photographs or video of any child participating in summer camp activities, and may use these images for marketing purposes. No compensation will be made for the use of these images.

Tuition, Payments and Refunds Enrollment is on a first-come, first-served basis. Campers must pay a non-refundable deposit to reserve their place. The balance is due by June 1, 2018. If payment in full is not made by this date, camper enrollment may be subject to cancellation at the discretion of the camp director. New registrations on or after June 1, 2018 must be accompanied by a payment in full. A portion of the tuition (\$100 per full-day or half-day session and \$75 per individual program) is a non-refundable deposit and will not be returned for any reason. A full refund less the deposit will be given up until June 1, 2018. After June 1, 2018, tuition is forfeited and may be transferable subject to availability. If camp weeks are cancelled with less than 2 full weeks notice, the weeks will NOT be transferable. If unforeseen conditions, including, but not limited to, hurricanes, power outages, and epidemics, cause IMACS to shut down its summer camp for any length of time, no tuition will be refunded, credited, and transferred.

Discounts Multiple class and sibling discounts of 10% are available for any full day, half day, and individual programs within each session. Please see the current enrollment form or tuition schedule for discounted prices.

Conduct and Discipline Campers are expected to conduct themselves in an orderly manner and to treat those working around them with respect. Campers whose behavior is disruptive to the class will be removed from the classroom, and their parents will be notified. The directors reserve the right, at their sole discretion, to withdraw any camper whose influence or actions are deemed unsatisfactory or detrimental to the camp or who will not abide by the camp rules and policies. If this occurs, no reduction or return of fee, or any part thereof, will be made.

Attendance and Punctuality Campers should make every attempt to attend all classes. IMACS does not offer individualized make-up classes.

Pickup Procedures It is essential that a parent or other authorized adult pick up campers when classes are over. Single-class campers should be picked up inside the building by a parent.

Full-day and half-day campers will assemble after camp (4:20pm for full-day and 12noon for half-day), and walk with the instructors to the front of the school to meet the parents. If a child's parent is not there, the child will come back inside and wait in the after-care room. In this case, it will be the parent's responsibility to come into the building to pick up the child. Parents who fail to pick up their children within fifteen minutes of the end their individual class are considered late and will be charged a \$10.00 fee unless a previous arrangement has been made with the staff. In case of emergencies or other situations over which parents have little control, parents should try to telephone IMACS in order to alert the staff. Extended day care is available for Full-day campers until 5:30pm. Lunch care is available for half-day campers until 1pm. When filling out the course selection area, be sure to indicate whether you need to purchase after-care or lunch care. If an adult other than a parent is to pick up a student, IMACS staff must be notified prior to the pickup. We require written parental permission to allow a child to leave the building without supervision (i.e., to walk home or out to the car by himself or herself).

First Aid & Medications It is the responsibility of parents to provide IMACS with emergency phone numbers and instructions. IMACS staff are not allowed to administer first aid or to dispense over-the-counter medications to any camper without express prior written permission of parents. A first aid kit is available for any camper requiring an antiseptic or Band-Aid. All possible precautions are taken to ensure that the activities at IMACS Summer Camp are conducted in a safe and responsible manner. However, because of the nature of some of the activities, regardless of the high degree of supervision, there is a potential for accidental injury. Parents agree to assume these risks and to release IMACS, its officers, directors, employees and agents from, hold them harmless from and waive any claim against IMACS as to any injury that may occur to their child(ren) while attending IMACS Summer Camp.

Lunch & Snacks Campers should bring lunch in a cold pack. Snacks and drinks are available for purchase at IMACS for \$0.75 each. Campers may also bring their own snacks. At some locations, G or PG movies may be shown during the lunch break. Your signature below verifies that you permit your child to watch these movies.
